# **Bob Harris**

Bob Harris' memoir of his three decades of work as the Warden of Skellig Michael, *Returning Light: Thirty Years on the Island of Skellig Michael*, received unanimous praise from critics and was an international bestseller.

Rising from the Atlantic eight miles off the coast of County Kerry, the island is a UNSECO World Heritage site, and the most spectacularly situated of all the early medieval island monastic sites in Ireland.

Writing for the *New York Times Book Review*, Margaret Renkl exclaimed, "It is impossible to do justice to the beauty of *Returning Light*. The whole book is a poem."



# **Frank Groome**

Frank Groome, PhD, was appointed the Consul General of Ireland to the US Southeast in August 2024. Based in Atlanta, he leads Ireland's team covering Georgia, Kentucky, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Tennessee.

Dr. Groome was the Deputy Head of Mission at the Irish Embassy in The Hague between 2020 and 2024. Prior to that he was Deputy Director for Disarmament and Non-Proliferation in the Department of Foreign Affairs in Dublin.

Frank holds a Master's degree in law from King's College London and Doctorate in diplomatic history from University College Dublin.



# Jennifer O'Mahoney

Dr. Jennifer O'Mahoney is a Senior Lecturer in Psychology at South East Technological University (SETU) and a Chartered Member of the Psychological Society of Ireland.

Dr O'Mahoney's research explores how trauma and victim-survivor narratives are remembered and represented. She is the Principal Investigator of the Waterford Memories Project, examining the lived experiences of those affected by historical institutional abuse in Ireland. She is also the Irish Co-Investigator for the EU project Women's Online Wellbeing: A European Exploration of Digitalised Violence Against Women.

Her work bridges academia and public discourse, ensuring that research on trauma, memory, and social justice reaches wider audiences and contributes to meaningful societal change.




